This project is perfect craft for days when the kids are getting restless & you need a fun & easy craft to do! You can make it with materials you probably already have at home and it's a great way to create personalized thank you cards, door signs, artwork or even gift tags!



That 320/ YOU (

- Crayons
- White cardstock, thick paper is best
- Painter's tape
- Butcher paper or newspaper
- Black tempura paint (don't worry, it's washable)
- Laundry detergent
- Mixing bowl or plate
- A small roller brush to paint with
- Items to scratch with: forks, spoons, or nail care orange sticks



## What to Do

- 1. **Spread out some butcher paper** or newspaper to cover your workspace. Tape it down so it will stay secured.
- 2. Color to your heart's content! You can fold the white cardstock in half to make a card or color the whole sheet. Use lots of different colors so that you'll end up with an interesting design. **PRO TIP**: the darker you color the better your design will show up later on!
- 3. After coloring your paper, you'll need to **mix up the paint**. In a plate or mixing bowl, stir together a one-to-one ratio of tempura paint to laundry detergent. We used about 2 spoonfuls of each ingredient per sheet of paper.
- Once you've stirred up the paint, use the roller brush to apply a thick coat to the colored paper. After all the design is covered, let it dry for about 30 minutes to an hour.
- 5. Next, **apply a thick second coat**. Once again, wait 30 minutes to an hour for it to dry. Check and paint on a third coat after the second is dry if the paint is not opaque. In most cases two coats should be enough.
- 6. Now for the moment we've all been waiting for: the scratch off! You can scratch away the paint to reveal the colors underneath, the kids will thoroughly enjoy this part and so will you! You can write a message or simply doodle away, just have fun with it!
